What is the Interactive Theater Program?



The tool of the Interactive Theater was used and formulated according to the development and the beginning of the emergence of civil societies after searching for parallel and creative solutions and horizons for new ways to confront problems and issues.

The use of this tool involves theater from the community to the community, in one form that interactive performances may be designed entirely by the community without any outside assistance, or with the participation of theater technicians, or entirely by theater artists directed to specific community groups.

Basic Elements of Interactive Theatre

It is a theater committed to the community, through which the audience interacts in different ways and it is sensitive to cultures and the theme must fit the situation and the general culture of the area. It should also be open to minorities who attend the theater or even those with unheard voices.

We can work in interactive theater with small or large groups, and aim for change on a personal and societal level.

The theater is not based on one person. Rather, it is a workspace for all people to feel that they are the decision makers in the performance. The more there is ownership of the people, and we make them feel that the topic belongs to them and for them, the better the result will be.

Program objective

The interactive theater program aims to create dialogues about societal issues and problems in society through the interactive theater tool (an effective non-violent dialogue tool).

Target Group

This guide is intended for people aged 18 and over, who are active in their local communities and who have access to different segments.

The Main Training Axes

1. Basics of Interactive Theater.
2. Understanding the societal systems (analysis, monitoring, a study of need, observation, intervention).
3. Build interactive presentations.
4. Build campaigns using interactive theater.

Expected Outcomes

- Improvisation in the theater and the role of theater in education.
- The basics of interactive theater and image theater.
- Theatrical empowerment of non-actors.
- Study of societal systems (analysis - study of need - intervention).
- Building an interactive presentation.
- Interactive presentations discussing societal issues.

Initiatives

After the training, participants will be supported to implement interactive presentations in their local communities, after they study the needs of their communities and reflect problems and issues through interactive presentations that address them.
